EDA is working to renew its category rules on the Product Environmental Footprint (PEF):

EDA is continuing its work for renewing the validity of the Dairy PEF rules, the methodology assessing the environmental footprint of dairy products in the EU. Approved by EU Commission and Member States in 2018, the Dairy PEF is considered the reference methodology for the sector, and provides a harmonized set of rules at European level. It takes into account a broad range of criteria and it calculates the environmental performance of dairy products across their life cycle.

The renewal project, coordinated by the EDA and supported by a consultancy, will extend the validity of the dairy rules, allowing companies to continue using such methodology.

EDA exchanges with UK government department on EU - UK dairy trade

The chair of our EDA Trade Task Force, Lise Andreasen Høyer (DDB), had the pleasure to welcome Philipp Seising, the head of the Food and Veterinary department of the UK mission in Brussels at our trade meeting, with DEFRAS' (Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs) Richard Watson and his team.

"The EU–UK trade relationship is of utmost importance for UK and EU dairy. Our regular EDA meetings with the UK authorities really helped over the past years to better understand the processes and to prepare for any chances in the procedures. That's why Richard Watson and Philipp Seising have been discussing with us at our EDA trade meeting, especially on the so-called Border Target Operating Model, a global risk based border security approach, was of high added value", concluded Lise Andreasen Høyer.

The Brussels agenda for the coming months

After the summer break, we met with DG AGRI deputy director general **Pierre Bascou** and his colleague **Carlos Martin Ovilo** to discuss the dossiers that are on the DG AGRI agenda for the coming months. We also had an opportunity to exchange with Dr. **Andreas Schneider**, member of the cabinet of EU COM **Janusz Wojciechowski**.

When looking at the "mission letter" sent to EU COM Janusz Wojciechowski at the beginning of his mandate (01 December 2019), it is safe to say, that DG AGRI delivered, not least on the heavy dossier of the new CAP2023 and its implementation. Other pending DG AGRI dossiers are progressing well in the Brussels machine room, like the School Milk Scheme, the EU Promotion Policy, the revision of EU Marketing Standards and of the EU Quality Policy.

Hoekstra (EPP) to replace Timmermans (S&D)

The political season in Brussels is likely to start with the appointment of former Dutch foreign minister **Wopke Hoekstra** as EU climate Commissioner.

The Dutch government put forward Wopke Hoekstra, a member of the Christian Democratic party (CDA-EPP) in the Netherlands, as replacement for **Frans Timmermans** from Socialists & Democrats (S&D) who is expected to be the top candidate for the Dutch Labour Party (PvdA) in the Dutch general election November 2023.

The new Dutch nominee now has to prepare for the mandatory hearing in the European Parliament. We expect that the cabinet will remain largely in place, although in charge of a smaller portfolio. Wopke Hoekstra's role will fall under the oversight of the EU Commission Vice-President Maroš Šefčovič (S&D) who will be leading the Commission's work on the European Green Deal.

Fairme (fairme.io) , a Grenoble based startup, has designed a fully autonomous multi-product dairy processing machine for daily processing of milk volumes of 250 to 1500 kg. The team of 26 engineers specialising in robotics, IoT and AI has succeeded in designing a 100% autonomous, multi-product, scalable milk processing unit that fully meets the food safety and food quality requirements. With cofinancing by the EU, the startup now invests into scaling up its operations.

This "processing unity", plugged directly to the farms milking parlour, can be set up to process raw milk in a fully autonomous way into a whole range of dairy products via a simple web application.

"We seek to respond to the growing trend of eating healthy and local and of enjoying minimally processed farm products – and milk and dairy is here the perfect starting point. On the other hand, the model of the farmer taking care of breeding, milking, processing and then distribution and sale requires a considerable number of working hours and investments, which are the main obstacles to its development. That's where our innovation steps in: the processing unit works fully autonomously and our Fairme teams do not only take care of the maintenance of the processing unit, but also of the marketing and sales", states **Nathan Freret**, head of business & operations at Fairme.
